IntraHealth International's HIV/AIDS
Clinical Services Program (HCSP) reinforces
Rwanda's health care system and expands
access to comprehensive HIV/AIDS services in the
districts of Gasabo, Gicumbi, Nyagatare and Rulindo.
The five-year, \$27 million dollar program is funded
by the U.S. Agency for International Development
(USAID).

Launched in June 2007 in partnership with the University of North Carolina's Center for Infectious Diseases, Mildmay International and the districts of Gasabo, Gicumbi, Nyagatare and Rulindo, HCSP collaborates with Rwanda's Ministry of Health (MOH) to expand HIV/AIDS clinical service activities and capacity in:


- Prevention of mother-to-child transmission;
- Counseling and testing;
- Antiretroviral therapy services;
- Palliative care;
- TB/HIV integration;
- Family planning integration;
- Gender-sensitive care;
- Other prevention services including abstinence, be faithful and condom-based prevention and prevention of medical transmission.

HCSP strengthens national and district systems through:

- 1 Ensuring Clinical Excellence
- 2 Extending Services through Innovation and Integration
- 3 Community Linkages
- 4. Incorporating Gender-Sensitive and Appropriate Services
- 5 Promoting Leadership, Management and Accountability

Integration for more effective


service: HCSP strengthens and monitors family planning and HIV/AIDS service integration to ensure streamlined, thorough care and treatment. The MOH has selected one HCSP site as an integration model for other health facilities.

Increasing Access through

Inclusiveness: HCSP is exemplary in its approaches of male involvement and couples testing. In only six weeks as part of Rwanda's nationwide 2008 World AIDS campaign, HCSP tested 28,527 individuals.

Extending Services through Mobile District Physicians: HCSP

supports a scheme whereby district physicians travel weekly to health centers, allowing patients more time with a physician and strengthening existing referral systems. The MOH has called for it to be extended to other districts.
